On September 26, 2023, BSF was thrilled to launch the Dr. Barrie Strafford Centre for Learning, Innovation & Quality. This new BSF Centre brings together various roles within the organization dedicated to innovation, organizational learning, quality improvement, and research to further BSF's mission 'to be an innovative force in optimizing wellbeing and enriching lives.'

The purpose of this new centre is to drive continuous innovation, learning and quality improvement within BSF. The centre will form alliances and craft innovative solutions that promise far-reaching impact on the future of work, aging, and community support systems, solving challenges from the inside, out. The role of the centre will also be focussed on extending the value of our findings and solutions to other organizations and, most crucially, effecting a meaningful social impact.

The Dr. Barrie Strafford Centre for Learning, Innovation & Quality was launched on the anniversary of the birthday of our founder, Dr. Barrie Strafford. It commemorates



his entrepreneurial spirit and the passion he had for Innovation, Quality, and Learning. The Brenda Strafford Foundation dedicating this new centre in Dr. Strafford's name memorializes his significant personal contribution to the legacy of the foundation.

At BSF, we believe in the power of collective problemsolving, targeting solutions that bring about tangible, positive changes. The centre is not a standalone unit within our organization. Rather, it is a dynamic and fully integrated team committed to collaboratively solving challenges. A case in point is our ongoing research at the Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging in partnership with the University of Calgary. Located together in a collaborative space with BSF's Cambridge Manor, the Dr. Barrie Strafford Centre for Learning, Innovation & Quality will work closely with the Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging at the vanguard of where research meets practice.

As part of this initiative we're going to be exploring innovations to enhance mental health support in continuing care settings, to help staff identify residents at risk for mental health concerns, offer holistic strategies for prevention, and support ongoing therapy options that are accessible and feasible within a continuing care context.

Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging

The Brenda Strafford Foundation and University of Calgary enhance strategic collaboration through the Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging

BSF and the University of Calgary have announced a new agreement that will enhance strategic collaboration through research and education facilitated by the Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging. The new memorandum of understanding is the latest milestone in a long-standing relationship between the foundation and university that facilitates a greater commitment and a more collaborative working relationship on aging-related research and education conducted through the Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging.

As part of the new agreement, an Aging Research Leadership Council has been established for oversight of the centre's operations and investments in mutually beneficial aging-related research activities on behalf of BSF and the university. This will include all BSF agingrelated research activities, locally and abroad.



UNIVERSITY OF CALGARY

O'Brien Institute for Public Health Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging

The Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging was first established at the University of Calgary in 2011, through a philanthropic gift from BSF. The centre was created to enhance the health and wellness of older adults and to better inform public policy regarding older adults' issues through coordinated research, teaching and learning, and community outreach efforts.

In 2020, the connection between the Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging and BSF was further enhanced when the centre moved to its home within BSF's Cambridge Manor aging care and senior living community. Based out of Cambridge Manor, the location is near the university campus, which enables researchers and students from across various faculties greater access to this dynamic research and learning environment within an assisted living and long-term care setting.

Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging launches 2023-28 Strategic Plan

In September 2023, the Brenda Strafford Centre on Aging launched a new strategic plan. UCalgary, BSCOA leadership, and BSF staff worked collaboratively through this planning process to outline the centre's priorities and goals over the next 5 years to realize its vision: Optimal health and well-being for older adults driven by evidence and in an inclusive manner.

These strategic priorities include:

- 1.Demonstrate leadership in rethinking facility-based continuing care by establishing an experiential ecosystem for innovation.
- 2.Catalyze transdisciplinary aging research and scholarship with a focus on creating age-inclusive innovations, environments, practices, and policies that also consider intersecting health inequities.
- 3.Enhance the age-friendliness of UCalgary and the City of Calgary, including addressing ageism and promoting age-inclusivity.

Innovation Spotlight

Cambridge Manor is one of the first seniors care sites in North America to use the Crdl device as part of our therapeutic recreation programs! Crdl is an innovative instrument, created in the Netherlands, that promotes meaningful connection and compassion.



To use the Crdl, two or more users each place one hand on the instrument and their other hand on each other. Crdl magically translates touch into unique sounds, allowing users to experience meaningful memories and emotions. Devices and technologies, such as Crdl, help us to provide inclusive, meaningful and therapeutic ways for our residents, families, and staff to connect and engage with one another.

Crdl has been piloted at Cambridge Manor, with plans to use across BSF sites.
